### Call for Papers NRB Economic Review

The NRB Economic Review, previously published as "Economic Review Occasional Paper", is a peer-reviewed Economic Journal and is being published twice a year in April and October. The Editorial Board of the Journal invites submission of articles for its next issue (October, 2011) that focuses on quantitative analysis of any pertinent area(s) of the Nepalese economy. Articles on regional as well as global economic issues that include the Nepalese experiences can also be submitted for the publication.

**Submission Deadline: 15 September 2011**

#### GUIDELINES FOR ARTICLE SUBMISSION

Submission of a paper to the Review will be taken to imply that it represents original work not previously published, and it is not being considered elsewhere for publication, and that if accepted for publication, it will not be published anywhere without the consent of the Editorial Board. The articles so received are subject to a double blind review process. Those articles are then subject to approval by the Editorial Board; however, the ideas and opinions expressed in the articles published in the Review are solely those of authors. The contents of articles in no way represent views and policies of the Nepal Rastra Bank or that of the Editorial Board.

Submitted articles should be written in English, typed in double spacing with wide margins (3 cm) on one side of standard paper. The title page should contain the title, the name, institutional affiliation(s), JEL classification, key words, full postal address, telephone/fax number and E-mail of each author, and, if there are more than one author, indicate which author is responsible for correspondence. In case the author is provided grant or any type of financial support from any organization or institution, this should be spelled out clearly below the key words. Footnotes, if any, should be numbered consecutively with superscript arithmetic numerals at the foot of each page. Figures and tables should be on separate sheets and have descriptive titles. References in the text should follow the author-date format and followed, if necessary, by the page numbers [for example, Hemphill (1974, 637)]. References should be listed alphabetically in the following style:

- Goldstein, Morris, and Mohsin Khan. 1985. "Income and Price Effects in Foreign Trade." In R. W. Joners and P. B. Kenen, eds., *Handbook of International Economics*, vol. II. New York: Elsevier.
- Hemphill, William. 1974. "The Effect of Foreign Exchange Receipts on Imports of Less Developed Countries." *IMF Staff Papers* 21: 637–77.

The article should be accompanied by an abstract not exceeding 300 words, and the preferred maximum length of a submission is 10,000 words.
